

Lambourn Neighbourhood Development Plan

Advice from West Berkshire Council Archaeology

Assessment of Archaeological Potential

Lambourn parish can be said to have some of the highest archaeological potential in West Berkshire, partly due to its occupation and exploitation by humans for thousands of years (see Statement of Significance below) but also because of its largely rural nature with limited modern development. In terms of nationally designated heritage, it has 137 [Listed Buildings](#), the second largest number after Newbury, which has a much larger built up area. For [Scheduled Monuments](#), it leads West Berkshire parishes with 21 scheduled areas (the number of individual monuments such as barrows within these areas is much higher, but in the case of Membury Hillfort there is double counting with a Wiltshire reference). There are no [Registered Parks and Gardens](#) apart from a sliver of the landscape around Ashdown House in Oxfordshire, and no [Registered Battlefields](#), but the number of non-designated heritage assets in the parish could be considered to be very high. This includes nationally important archaeology that isn't scheduled, this designation being discretionary, as well as unrecognised important buildings, structures and areas. No heritage assets of local interest have yet been added to West Berkshire's [Local List](#). Even within the plough-soil that lies over cropmarked features there is a high potential of recovering artefacts of national or local importance, which emphasises why anyone finding such objects should report them to the [Portable Antiquities Scheme](#). Though Lambourn has attracted archaeological attention, much of the parish has never been subject to intrusive excavation.

Statement of Significance

Statement of significance of the NDP area (described here as 'Lambourn') in each period from the Mesolithic to the Modern – archaeological remains from earlier than the Mesolithic period are occasionally discovered but will not be in situ, ie will be redeposited artefacts. The date ranges of the periods below are approximate, with overlap clearly occurring.

Mesolithic (10,000 BC – 4,001 BC)

A few flint tools assigned to this period have been recovered but not in great concentrations. It seems unlikely there is much potential in most of the parish, but the recent chance discovery of Britain's oldest piece of carved wood in Boxford suggests that the lower parts of the Lambourn river valley could possibly hold organic remains.

Neolithic (4,000 – 2,351 BC)

Lambourn has the important but sadly diminished long barrow at the head of a now dry valley, the first large monument near which other funerary monuments were later constructed (the widespread 'Seven Barrows' cemetery). There is other evidence of Neolithic burials, and several findspots of Neolithic flint tools, but settlements are elusive. A cropmark on Eastbury Fields may represent a second long barrow, and some round barrows may have originated in the Late Neolithic period. There is moderate potential for more discoveries.

Bronze Age (2,350 – 801 BC)

Lambourn is extremely significant for this prehistoric period, with large numbers of funerary monuments known from upstanding barrows and

cropmarked ring ditches, the vast majority of which have not been excavated. The archaeological potential is high. The rich hoard of gold armlets and bracelets found at Crow Down is of Middle Bronze Age date, and a likely Late Bronze Age settlement was discovered at Weathercock Hill. There are several linear earthworks which may have defined 'ranch' boundaries, and which could be of Late Bronze Age origin.

Iron Age (800 BC – 42 AD)

The linear bank and ditches may have continued to form boundaries in the landscape in the Iron Age; another large-scale construction was the hillfort at Membury, part of which is now within Lambourn parish. By the later Iron Age there was widespread arable cultivation, seen in the so called 'Celtic fields' that until the mid-20th century were often visible as earthwork lynchets on the Downs but have since been reduced to cropmarks or soilmarks through modern agriculture. The significance and potential for this later prehistoric period, overlapping with the Bronze Age, is high.

Romano-British (43 – 409 AD)

This is also an important archaeological period for Lambourn, with the Roman road of Ermin Street (closely aligned with the B4000) running northwest towards Cirencester, a complex of Roman buildings at Maddle Farm and other likely settlements at Baydon Road and Stancombe Down. There have been finds of Roman structures and artefacts in Lambourn town and burials in Upper Lambourn and at Kingsdown. Roman material is widespread across the parish, and there is likely to have been some continuous use of the fields from the Late Iron Age to the Romano-British periods.

Early Medieval/ Anglo-Saxon (401 – 1065 AD)

Lambourn's large parish size (the largest in the pre-1974 Berkshire county) has been suggested to originate in Roman or even earlier land divisions, but its development as a Hundred (incorporating East Garston) and as an ecclesiastical parish perhaps with a minster is linked to its high significance in the early medieval period. The Saxons are known to have utilised the Lambourn valley at an early date, with a 5th to 6th century pagan cemetery discovered at East Shefford (there is also some evidence for secondary burials at Sevenbarrows). The rare sunken featured buildings found during the development of Oaksey House in Lambourn may be as early as the 5th century, though could also be two or three centuries later – dating was problematic. But Lambourn's mention in King Alfred's will in 888 AD also indicates its status, perhaps as a site of royal residence. The oval enclosure within Lambourn's plan form is noteworthy and still retains archaeological potential, despite the 20th century infilling of the grounds of the demolished Lambourn Place within it. The Domesday Survey mentions the church and two mills in Lambourn; one mill was probably in Newbury Street but the other was upstream at an unknown exact location. The manor of Bockhampton was also in existence in Saxon times.

Medieval (1066 – 1539 AD)

Much of the structure and layout of surviving historic settlement in the parish of Lambourn was laid down in the medieval period and the late 11th century is when the first documentary evidence appears for the two other important villages of Upper Lambourn and Eastbury, though these may have developed earlier. Also of medieval origin or later Saxon origin were the surrounding open fields that would have been divided into strips and worked communally. The parish's Grade I listed building, St Michael and All Angels Church, is

described as one of the most impressive churches in Berkshire, and there are Grade II* listed medieval crosses in the centre of Lambourn and Eastbury. Lambourn town was important enough to have a fair and market. There were several medieval manors, with Manor Farmhouse at Eastbury being a particular important survival. Timber framed buildings may be as early as the 16th century, particularly those with cruck frames such as at Upper Lambourn.

Post-medieval (1540 – 1900 AD)

Much more heritage is upstanding and visible from this period, greatly adding to the character of Lambourn particularly in the form of vernacular buildings. This includes many 18th and 19th century farmsteads and outfarms (although few are in agricultural use), but also almshouses, chapels, schools and inns. This period also saw the beginning of the racehorse industry and the creation of gallops but there have already been losses in historic buildings associated with stables and their owners. Industrial sites would have been small scale and remains are few. The significance of this period is primarily local.

Modern (1901 – Present)

Lambourn parish's only area of parkland is at Inholmes, surrounding a listed Edwardian house, on the site of an older building. The creation of a Second World War airfield at Membury has left some buildings and structures from the dispersed sites, although these are increasingly being demolished for development. Much of the modern development within the parish is not of high significance, though there are some architecturally interesting buildings on the Downs such as at Sheepdrove.

Summary of historic character and research questions

Report summarising the surviving historic character of the area. Suggested further research to better inform future development

It is difficult to condense the historic character of such a large parish into a few sentences, and more detail is available in the Historic Environment Character Zoning Project documents (Historic Environment Character Areas or HECAs with nested Zones or HECZs). At a broad level there is a distinct difference in character between the Lambourn Valley HECA with nucleated settlements concentrated in the valley floor, and a very open feel with few woods, and the Wooded Downs Plateau HECA to the south, with a dispersed settlement pattern including many farms, small scale enclosures and a greater coverage of trees. This differing pattern may date back millennia.

The HECZ documents list research questions and these are used by any archaeological contractor undertaking investigations, including for development and land-use changes. Some of the most significant questions to be answered include understanding the chronology from Romano-British to Saxon activity in the parish, and whether there was any continuity or a clear divide. Finding any evidence of an early medieval royal establishment would be another aim, particularly in and around the oval enclosure in Lambourn itself. Recent work in Upper Lambourn suggests a Roman settlement was nearby, and there should be many other contemporary farms in line with the extensive field systems on the Downs. There may be others related to the Roman road Ermin Street crossing the southern part of the parish.

There is other information gathering and research that could be undertaken in line with the production of the Neighbourhood plan, and much advice on this is given in

Historic England's publication and webpages - <https://historicengland.org.uk/advice/planning/improve-your-neighbourhood>. The three Conservation Areas are in need of appraisals and management plans, and whilst this may be outside the scope of the NDP, it should be an aspiration to get these undertaken. Preliminary research can give a better evidence base – I note that much historical material is now being collated on the village website <https://lambourn.org/history/>. Undertaking a survey of designated buildings and structures and their condition would be one useful piece of research; another would be identifying non-designated heritage assets which could be candidates for the Local List – there must be hundreds in a parish as large and historic as Lambourn. The NDP would be an excellent place to note these buildings, features and places that are valued by the community, particularly ones located outside Conservation Areas.

Opportunities to enhance the historic environment

Suggestions of where opportunities may exist to enhance or restore the historic environment through development

The Historic Environment Character Zone (HECZ) documents give pointers as to their Conservation Issues and common threads are:

- Modern development is eroding character
- More detail is needed on the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource – this is not confined to Lambourn, Upper Lambourn and Eastbury and would also apply to the areas of scattered settlement and old farms.
- There is a need to ensure that any new tree planting avoids the visually and archaeologically erosive impacts of recent plantations.
- Ancient woodland has not been well managed in recent years and this poses a threat to its survival.
- Intensive modern agriculture threatens the resource on buried archaeological sites

One of the most striking conclusions from the HLC project relates to the perception of downland within the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Despite its name being the North Wessex Downs, with the particular belt of chalkland here also being referred to as the Lambourn Downs, there is very little true downland left, ie what was classified as *Open areas of close-cropped chalk grassland, used as grazing for animals, mostly sheep*. This land use would have been part of the common grazing regime that operated in many Downs parishes, particularly Lambourn, in the medieval period but was subject to Parliamentary Enclosure and then reorganisation in the 20th century with a change to more intensive arable cultivation. There was a strong correlation between the survival of prehistoric and Roman archaeology and the downland land use. Reversion from arable to pasture would be beneficial for any remaining below ground archaeological features, and re-creation of species rich grassland would have multiple benefits for biodiversity and probably carbon capture as well.

Topography, Geology and Soils

This area is the Lambourn valley and the surrounding downs from Bagnor to the valley heading northwest of Lambourn. The valley has a narrow floor with many dry valleys cut into the valley sides from its watersheds with the Kennet and Winterbourne. The geology of the area is almost entirely chalk, although small areas of Reading Beds occur on the upper valley slopes south of Weston and a narrow band of gravel exists in the valley floor. Flinty brown calcareous earths exist over the valley floor with clayey palaeo-argyllic brown earths on the valley sides south of East Garston and flinty rendzinas to the north and onto the downs.

Historic Landscape

The medieval landscape of this area was based on nucleated settlements on the valley floor, with open fields on the valley sides and common grazing on riverside meadows and downs at the head of the valley and on its sides. The majority of the open field south of East Garston was enclosed into fields by the 18th century. Most were irregularly-shaped and slotted into the framework of the landscape established by roads and tracks and open field strips, suggesting that they were enclosed on a gradual, piecemeal basis. Significant areas of more regularly-shaped early enclosures existed around East Shefford, East Garston and Welford. These were probably created following an agreement between local land-holders and farmers to rationalise and enclose holdings in the common fields. The meadows had also largely been enclosed by this date; some were simply enclosed into pasture fields, but the majority became water meadows. These covered the valley floor between East Garston and Bagnor and formed the district's most significant concentration of water meadows outside the Kennet Valley. The majority of the remaining open fields and downs, including almost all of Lambourn parish, were enclosed into fields through Act of Parliament in the early 19th century. The only unenclosed downland that remained were small areas west of Lambourn and north of East Garston.

Woodland was historically very sparse in this area with little ancient or other historic broadleaf woodland. Woods were almost entirely absent from the upper part of the valley. Some blocks of ancient woodland did exist but they were generally small and most were in the south of the area near its edge. The only large ancient wood was on the southern edge of Welford Park, the single substantial park in the area.

Settlement was nucleated and concentrated in a few large villages and hamlets of medieval or earlier origin. These were sited on the valley floor and were spaced at fairly regular intervals. Farms were not common and were located either along the river in gaps between the hamlets and villages or, more commonly, on the upper slopes of the valley. Most were named after adjacent settlements or topographic features.

Modern Landscape

Agricultural mechanisation from the mid 20th century led to a dramatic alteration of this landscape as existing fields were amalgamated into larger holdings, either through boundary removal or through reorganisation. Many historic features, such as hedgerows, were removed, creating expanses of relatively featureless arable fields. This trend also saw the enclosure of the majority of remaining downland for further large arable fields.

Historic Environment Character Area

Downland is now found only in small areas on steep scarp slopes where farming is uneconomic or impractical. Some historic fields do survive as functioning parts of the farming landscape, mostly around Boxford and Bagnor, but these are usually isolated instances of a couple of fields. Active management of water meadows ceased in the earlier 20th century and most became pasture or fields. Some have become wooded areas, either through active plantation or gradual scrubbing over and re-colonisation.

Due to the growth of Lambourn as a nationally important centre of the racehorse industry, large parts of the landscape are now covered by land-uses related to horse breeding and training. This is most evident around Lambourn itself where significant areas of former fields and downs are now extensive stretches of paddocks and gallops. Several studs have been established, including some that have developed at historic farms in the downs above Lambourn.

A large American military base exists at Welford. The base started as an RAF airfield in WWII and has now become one of the USAF's most significant European bomb stores. Most previous land-use features, including field boundaries and a large area of ancient woodland, were removed by construction of the base.

There has been a slight increase in tree cover across the whole area. Woodland regeneration has contributed to this but the rise is largely due to the creation of tree plantations. Some plantations are 19th century in date, but most were created in the late 20th century and many were funded by the Woodland Grant Scheme. Most were created as shelter features and are small and rectilinear. They are often sited in the middle of fields and usually do not fit with the established grain of landscape. This is most visible in Lambourn parish, previously an almost totally unwooded area that now contains many oddly-shaped plantations that jar with the landscape. Despite overall growth, areas of ancient and other old woodland have been lost. Many were removed for cultivation or construction, as at RAF Welford, and some were replanted with non-native species. Replanted ancient woods exist between Boxford and Bagnor. These woods do not have the same biodiversity as ancient woodlands and clearance is likely to have damaged or removed historic features, such as woodbanks.

Settlement growth has been modest and confined largely to infill or growth around existing settlements and has centred on East Garston, West Shefford and Boxford. Most housing has been constructed since the later 20th century but a small amount of growth took place at East Garston in the late 19th century. Very few new settlement nuclei have been created.

The changes have had a significant impact on character, as large and regular arable expanses have been created over the whole of the area where previously there would have been either open downland or a more intimate network of smaller fields. Some of the historic feel is retained however due to minor settlement growth and the continued existence and use of the sinuous network of roads and tracks through the area.

WDP Wooded Downs Plateau

Topography, Geology and Soils

This area is the highest section of the Kennet – Lambourn watershed. It is a wide plateau that drops steeply away on the north side to the Lambourn valley and more gently to the Kennet on the south. There are no year round water-courses but the edge of the plateau is incised by the heads of dry valleys running into either river system. A single major dry valley cuts into the plateau itself and runs from Lambourn Woodlands, via Hungerford Newtown, to the Kennet at Kintbury. The geology is mainly chalk with occasional very localised outcrops of Reading Beds. The floor of the major dry valley has deposits of valley gravels. Soils are fairly uniform across the area and are clayey and flinty palaeo-argyllic brown earths.

Historic Landscape

This is a largely early enclosed landscape with substantial areas of woodland and a dispersed settlement pattern. The main route through the area was Ermin Street, the Roman road from Silchester to Cirencester, which ran along the crest of the watershed. Numerous small, sinuous roads and tracks branched off Ermin Street linking the plateau and the valley floors. Very little of the area remained unenclosed or not covered by mature woodland by the start of the 18th century. The fieldscapes were mostly composed of small-scale, irregularly-shaped enclosures interleaved with woodland. Some fields were identified as assarts and it is likely that other early enclosures may also be assarts; this could be clarified by further research. In the south-east of the area, fields are larger and more sinuous, suggesting that they may have been enclosed from open downland. In most cases there is no definite evidence of what kind of land the fields were created from, and the typical downs combination of open fields and common downland grazing seems absent from this area. Parliamentary enclosures were only present at King's Heath. This was an area of common heath that, unlike the rest of the area, had remained unenclosed into the 19th century.

Woodland was widely spread across the area. Most woodland is ancient; smaller areas of other old woods were also present. The ancient woodland was present in large blocks, most of which show signs of assartment.

The historic settlement pattern was dispersed and had no nucleated villages. It is typified by small discontinuous settlements, such as Lambourn Woodlands and Shefford Woodlands, which are strung out along the Roman road and lack a clear centre. Farms were fairly densely scattered across the area and most are named after individuals, such as Dixon's Farm and Gooding's Farm. There is evidence for slight settlement growth over the 18th and 19th centuries with new housing built along the Roman road.

Parklands were not commonly found in this area. Two smallish parks were established almost next-door to each other in the southern half of the area at Inholmes and Poughley.

The combination of farm names, assarted woodlands and the irregular early enclosed landscape suggests that this area had long been enclosed into fields, probably by individual farmers carving out their own farmland from the downs and woodlands. Much of this landscape is likely to date back at last to the medieval period.

Historic Environment Character Area

Modern Landscape

The western portion of the area has been heavily modified by the construction of Membury Airfield during WWII. This took an angular chunk out of the landscape, truncating surrounding fields, and included the insertion of shielding plantations of fast growing conifers around parts of the base's perimeter. Although now disused, the airfield still has a presence in the landscape. Most of the airfield area is farmed and the remains of runways and service routes form the boundaries of the fields. Many of the airfield buildings have been re-used as business and industrial premises leading to a small industrial estate developing in an otherwise very rural area. Membury motorway services have also been constructed within the former airfield footprint.

Across the rest of the area fieldscapes have seen large-scale rationalisation through a combination of field reorganisation and boundary removal. This has led to a much less irregular-looking landscape. Boundary removal was commonest in the assarts around East Garston Woodlands. The construction of the M4 motorway also contributed to this reorganisation through disruption and truncation of historic field systems. The conversion of historic enclosures into paddocks is common. They are most widespread around the Kingwood Stud but are also found in blocks across the rest of the area. Some blocks of historic fields survive around Lambourn Woodlands and East Garston Woodlands and south of King's Heath.

A few blocks of ancient woodland were cleared for agricultural use, mostly in the later 20th century. Some areas have also been cleared of their native woodland cover and been replanted with new trees; this is commonest to the south of Inholmes Park.

Settlement growth has been negligible and mostly consists of new houses or groups of houses constructed between historic settlement nuclei along the Roman road.

Inholmes and Poughley parks remain but have contracted slightly with some of their grounds having been turned over to agriculture.

L7B Lambourn Seven Barrows

Historic Character

This zone defines the extent of the Bronze Age barrow cemetery known as Lambourn Seven Barrows and related monuments. The zone stands near the head of a substantial dry valley that leads from the high downs to the Lambourn valley at Lambourn. Historically, the zone was covered by downland grassland and several routes across the downs converged at the barrows. Early in the 19th century a farm was established at Seven Barrows, and the downland enclosed into fields by Act of Parliament. Sevenbarrows Farm has now become a racing stable and the majority of this zone is covered by a mix of paddocks, gallops and arable areas. There has been some redevelopment and the addition of new stable facilities at the farm buildings. Many of the earthwork barrows are under grassland or survive as unmown areas within gallops and fields.

Historic Environment

The HER records for this zone are dominated by the Bronze Age funerary monuments. There was a programme of excavation on the barrows from 1850s, but although of a high standard for the time, the work was not fully published. Small scale further work followed in the late 19th century. The zone was covered by both the National Mapping Programme and the Berkshire Downs Survey and recent construction work has been subject to archaeological watching briefs. The core of the barrow cemetery and most of the barrows are scheduled monuments.

The earliest monument in this zone is a Neolithic long barrow lying on the County boundary with Oxfordshire, immediately north of Sevenbarrows Farm. This was amongst features investigated in the 1850s as well as previously by a local farmer, but it received additional attention in 1964 when a rescue excavation was mounted following extensive ploughing. Very little remained of the mound, but it was found to have a central core of sarsens with a cist burial at the east end.

The barrow cemetery itself consists of over 40 barrows; about 20 of them survive as earthworks and the remainder are known from cropmarks. The core of the cemetery is a group of at least 10 barrows arranged in two parallel rows, with the remaining mounds dispersed over a wide area to the north and south (including a few in Oxfordshire). There are several types of barrows within the cemetery, including bowl barrows and saucer barrows. The 1850s excavations yielded numerous finds including cremation burials and animal bones. Small-scale excavations in the late 1970s at Barrow 19 have shown that satellite burials also exist and a cremation pit on the edge of this barrow was dated to 1888-1671 BC. Fieldwalking between the long barrow and Sevenbarrows Farm found early Neolithic to late Bronze Age flintwork and sherds of late Bronze Age to early Iron Age pottery. Recent construction work at Sevenbarrows Farm led to the discovery of an undated crouched inhumation and further flintwork.

The area of the barrow cemetery was incorporated into an extensive Romano-British field system, but there seems to have been little activity between this and the construction of Sevenbarrows Farm in the early 19th century. However, there is the suggestion that some of the secondary interments may have been early medieval inhumations, as found in several other Bronze Age barrows in the district. A bronze brooch possibly found in one of the Seven Barrows in 1879 was identified as Saxon.

Despite recent re-construction, historic elements to the buildings at Sevenbarrows Farm seem to survive. The farmstead is recorded on the HER but no buildings are listed and nothing is known of their nature or significance. Sevenbarrows Farm is an isolated farm and such farms are

generally not common in this part of the downs. There is one listed building within this zone, the 18th to 19th century Longacre Farmhouse.

Historic Environment Potential

This zone contains significant extant Neolithic and Bronze Age monuments. The zone as a whole has a high potential for deposits relating to these features including burials. The extent of survival of primary funerary deposits at the ploughed-out examples is less clear. The zone is also likely to contain deposits related to Romano-British field systems. The nature and importance of the surviving historic buildings is unknown and it is possible that significant 19th century buildings or structural remains could exist.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- Management of core group of barrows by Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust continues and needs to be monitored. Recent fencing and rabbit removal will need to be monitored. Effects of grazing livestock will also require close monitoring.
- Need to remove outlying barrows from ploughing, especially those that remain visible as earthworks.
- Condition and management of other surviving barrows, as islands within the gallops also require monitoring.
- The right of way across the long barrow needs to be diverted on to the existing farm track that currently runs around the eastern end of the barrow.
- Long term efforts to remove modern hedges/shelter belts and reintegrate the barrow cemetery into a single landscape block should be a key objective.
- Ensure that any future development at the racing stable does not compromise the future management and interpretation of the barrow cemetery.

Research Potential

- What is the full date range and chronology of the barrow cemetery?
- Is it possible to understand the landscape context of the barrow cemetery, especially the relationship between the barrow cemetery and the Bronze Age site of Ram's Hill, Oxfordshire, about 3km to the northwest?
- Does any related Bronze Age settlement activity exist nearby?
- Can any definite evidence be found of secondary burials of early medieval date?
- What is the historic importance of the farm and its recent use as a racing stable?

LHC Lambourn Historic Core

Historic Character

A small historic village, Lambourn has been a focus of settlement from the early medieval period onwards. Much of the layout of the village is medieval, perhaps early medieval, and the main streets retain a large number of historic buildings dating back to the 18th century. Over the course of the 20th century, Lambourn became a national centre for the racehorse industry and this stimulated the growth of the village. Significant growth has occurred since the middle of the 20th century with housing developments constructed around the village edge in the 1960s and 1990s. Although there has been some redevelopment and infilling in the village core, this has been limited, and the historic character of the zone remains largely unaffected.

Historic Environment

HER records are quite dense in this zone and are composed mostly of standing buildings and documentary references. The zone was covered by the Berkshire Downs Survey and the National Mapping Programme, and several recent evaluations and watching briefs have been carried out on land being redeveloped. The Market Cross is the only scheduled monument in the zone.

No evidence of activity prior to the medieval period has been securely recorded from the *Lambourn Historic Core*. Evidence of significant later prehistoric and Romano-British activity is known from adjacent valley sides and it is possible that features or material of these periods may exist within the zone. A well containing Roman material was uncovered on the fringe of the zone at Bourne House Stables.

Lambourn was a royal estate in the early medieval period and the earliest reference to it was in the will of King Alfred in c888. The distinctive oval layout of the village's roads in the area north of the church is likely to date back to this period. A church is thought to have stood at the site of the present church since at least the early 11th century. The road layout and positioning of the church and market is similar to that seen at other settlements of this date. A palace might have existed during this period and it has been suggested that this could have been at Lambourn Place, but this has not been confirmed by any archaeological material. Some physical evidence for the settlement has been found with early medieval features excavated prior to redevelopment of land at the Red Lion and on Oxford Street.

Lambourn became a borough in the late medieval period, and it is possible that High Street was a planned extension to the early medieval settlement core, but it failed to flourish into a town and, with the exception of the church and related monuments, there are few recorded features of this date. Much of the present church dates to c1180; three extant chantry chapels were added to the church between the 14th century and early 16th century. The market place was mentioned in 1227 but had been mostly infilled with buildings by the 18th century and only a small area with a market cross now remains. The cross is largely medieval in date but also contains 18th century stonework and was restored in the 19th century. Lambourn Place is thought to be the site of the medieval manor. This building was replaced by a large Elizabethan-style house in the mid-19th century which was, in turn, demolished and redeveloped as housing in the 1990s. No reports of features relating to the manor were recorded at the time of its demolition or during the recent redevelopment of the site. Almshouses were established on Chapel Lane by the mid 15th century and in Three Post Lane in 1501. Both sets were rebuilt in the 19th century and it is unknown whether elements of the medieval structures survive.

Historic Environment Character Zone

Post-medieval records are dominated by standing structures and there are over 50 listed buildings within the village. The vast majority of these are houses, most of which are of 18th century date, although there are also seven listed 17th century houses and cottages and seven listed 19th century houses. The church, tombs and other churchyard features, the former school and the Red Lion Inn are also listed. The majority of historic buildings seem to be of 18th century date but, apart from the listing exercise, little other building analysis has been carried out and few structures have been studied in depth. It is, therefore, hard to say whether buildings were re-fronted or rebuilt in the 18th century and frontages of this date may conceal earlier, possibly medieval, structures. A large part of this zone is designated as a Conservation Area.

Historic Environment Potential

There has been no major archaeological or historic character study of the town since the Astill survey of 1978. This remains the most comprehensive review of the archaeological potential. The existing HER record is patchy and biased towards buildings. This is not surprising since the zone has been built up for several hundred years. The work that has been carried out has shown that buried deposits are present and archaeological potential should be high across much of the zone. It is possible that truncation of deposits may have occurred in places along the street frontage due to cellaring. The potential for pre-medieval deposits is totally unclear. The development of Lambourn as a settlement from the early medieval period onwards is very poorly understood. Deposits relating to occupation and burial of these periods are highly likely and will be crucial to understanding how the village developed. The historic building stock has been partially studied but it is likely that further significant buildings could be identified and possible that medieval structural elements could be discovered within later buildings.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- Conservation Area appraisal and management plan is overdue.
- Redevelopment of the small number of 'Brownfield' sites in the village centre presents an opportunity for archaeological research, but is a threat to the character of the settlement.
- The historic building stock is poorly understood and could therefore be threatened by inappropriate alterations/development.
- There is a need to stimulate greater interest in the history and historic environment potential within the community.
- More information about the form and character of the town is required to inform future development proposals.
- Need to undertake a new archaeological/historic character study.

Research Priorities

- Is there any Romano-British settlement activity in the zone?
- What was the date and location of the first early medieval (Saxon) settlement?
- Where was the location of the early medieval 'Royal' establishment? Can its character be established? Does the oval street pattern define the 'Royal' enclosure?
- How and when did the later medieval settlement expand away from the oval enclosure? What was the status of the later medieval settlement?
- What is the date and significance of the historic building stock in the village?

LRS Lambourn – Recent Settlement

Historic Character

This is a zone of late 20th century and recent housing developments that have expanded from the historic village of Lambourn. Prior to development the zone was part of Lambourn's agricultural hinterland and was composed of Parliamentary fields created from the village's open fields, downland and meadow. The area north of Upper Lambourn Lane was part of the parkland of Lambourn Place. Lambourn has become a national centre of the racehorse industry and this has stimulated growth of the village since the mid-20th century. Areas of housing were constructed on the east side of the village in the 1960s with that on the west built since the 1980s. Most of the 1960s development was built as council housing and consists of small estates with parks and schools. The more recent housing is a mix of large detached houses with extensive gardens and developments of densely-packed small houses.

Historic Environment

HER records exist across this zone but are not common. Records are dominated by findspots and deposits located as a result of construction work. The zone was covered by the Berkshire Downs Survey and the National Mapping Programme and several evaluations and watching briefs have been carried out prior to development.

Very limited evidence of activity prior to the medieval period has been recorded in this zone. An earthwork thought to be of later prehistoric date existed at Lambourn Place; most of this has now been covered by housing, but a small stretch of it remains in a field between The Park and the River Lambourn. It was partially excavated by local archaeologists in the 1930s but, although some Romano-British pottery was recovered, its date and function remains unclear. Evidence of significant later prehistoric and Romano-British activity is known from adjacent valley sides and it is possible that features or material of these periods may exist within the zone. Romano-British pottery was recovered from the construction of Lambourn station in the 1890s and from development near Stork House in the 1990s. The finds near Stork House came from within 100m of a site where some undated burials were discovered in 1980s and it is possible that these burials were contemporary.

Early medieval material has been recovered from several locations. Recent investigations at Bourne House Stables have located evidence of an early medieval date, including sunken floored buildings and finds of 7th – 8th century date. The Lambourn Place earthwork may be of this date, and it has been suggested it could be related to early occupation around the church and putative palace site. Pottery was found during construction at Northfields and a 6/7th century brooch was found on Hungerford Hill. The brooch had fabric imprints on its reverse and it might have come from a burial, suggesting the presence of a cemetery of this date in the area.

Few records for later periods exist and most are for late and post-medieval pottery and rubbish found during construction work. The only other recorded features relate to the Lambourn Valley Railway. This was constructed in the 1890s and terminated at Lambourn station where there were also goods sheds and cattle pens. The line was closed in the 1970s and the majority of its components, including the station, sheds and tracks were either demolished or removed. The site of the railway terminus has now been redeveloped.

Historic Environment Potential

Potential of this zone is very hard to assess as few HER records exist. Archaeological work in advance of development has demonstrated that features of medieval and perhaps earlier date

survive. By analogy with adjacent zones and evidence from archaeological work, there is potential for later prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval material.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- Development pressure is forcing settlement to expand out of the valley floor onto the lower slopes.
- The zone has high potential for Roman and early medieval archaeological discoveries.
- More detail is needed on the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource.

Research Priorities

- What was the nature and extent of Romano-British activity in the zone?
- Are the burials at Stork House Roman in date and do they indicate the presence of settlement activity nearby?
- Is there continuity of settlement from the Roman period to the current day?
- What was the date, nature and function of the earthwork between The Park and the River Lambourn?
- Do the recent discoveries at Bourne House Stables represent the earliest phase of the modern settlement? What does this site tell us about the spread of Saxon influence into West Berkshire in the years following the end of Roman rule?

LVAC Lambourn Valley – agricultural with extensive cropmarks

Historic Character

This is an agricultural zone on the northern slope of the Lambourn valley from Stancombe Down to Great Shefford. Historically, the zone was covered by a mix of downland and open fields with a few small ancient woods in the southeast. Only a small area of open fields, lying north of Maidencourt Farm, had been enclosed into fields by the 18th century, and these were mostly large, irregularly-shaped fields. Most downland in Lambourn Parish and all the remaining open fields were enclosed into large regularly-shaped fields by Act of Parliament in the early 19th century. A large tract of unenclosed downland remained north of East Garston with small areas west of Lambourn. Settlement was almost entirely absent and comprised only four farms: Stancombe Farm, Lodge Farm, Northfield Farm and East Shefford Farm. Many isolated field barns also existed across the zone. Two large ancient woods existed north of Lodge Farm and the fields in this area seem to have been created through assartment.

Agricultural mechanisation from the mid 20th century led to a dramatic alteration of this landscape. Existing fields were amalgamated into larger holdings, through boundary removal or reorganisation, leading to the removal of historic features such as hedgerows. Most remaining downland has been enclosed for further large arable fields and only one area remains at Winterdown Bottom. The changes have had a significant impact on character as large, regular arable expanses have been created over the whole zone where previously there would have been either open downland or smaller fields. Some settlement growth has occurred with the expansion of the built-up area of both East Garston and Great Shefford from the valley floor onto the valley side since the late 20th century.

Historic Environment

HER records are densely distributed across the zone and are dominated by cropmarks and findspots. The zone was covered by the Berkshire Downs Survey and the National Mapping Programme and both added significant numbers of records to the HER. Little developer-funded work has taken place, largely reflecting the lack of development in this zone, but local archaeologists have carried out fieldwalking and excavation on cropmarked features in the west of the zone. The only scheduled monuments in the zone are two bowl barrows at Stancombe Hatts.

Prehistoric records are widespread, but early material is fairly scarce. Scatters of worked flint were found during fieldwalking at Crow Down, Eastbury Down and Eastbury Fields. It is unclear what kind of activity is represented by these scatters and little other evidence of early prehistoric activity has been recovered. Bronze Age evidence is more widespread and consists largely of barrows and probable barrows. These include the two scheduled barrows at Stancombe Hatts, which are part of a larger cemetery of at least seven barrows that extends over the district boundary into Oxfordshire. Several cropmarks of ring-ditches exist on Warren Down and Stancombe Down including a barrow on Warren Down that survived until recently as an earthwork, but has now been ploughed out. A hoard of middle to late Bronze Age gold torcs/armlets and bangles was found at Crow Down in 2004, and subsequent small scale investigation suggests that this material may be related to a structure of some sort. There are at least two linear ditches, East Ditch and East Garston Ditch, which run north to south into the Lambourn Valley from the Ridgeway and appear to relate to late Bronze Age land divisions. Definite Iron Age material is scarce in this zone and consists only of late Iron Age brooches found on Eastbury Down.

Extensive cropmarks of field systems exist across the north of the zone, with substantial tracts also in the south at Eastbury Fields, East Garston Down and near Hasham Copse. Elements of the field-systems on the Lambourn Downs and near Hasham Copse survived until recently as earthworks, but have been levelled due to increased intensity of ploughing. The systems have generally been ascribed a later prehistoric/Romano-British date, but limited excavation has suggested that they are mainly Roman.

Significant Romano-British activity, in addition to the field-systems, is documented in this zone. A cemetery site and foundations of a villa were discovered during flint extraction on Stancombe Down in the late 19th century. The sites were partially excavated at the time of discovery and at least 12 inhumation burials were discovered. The presence of further buildings and burials is suggested by cropmarks of linear features and dark patches surrounding the site. Artefact scatters immediately north of Eastbury and on Bockhampton Down and Stancombe Down have been interpreted as settlements of this period. Finds of this period are not widespread, but include a bronze sceptre head from Eastbury in the form of a male head which has been interpreted as a cult object.

Medieval records are uncommon and consist of finds of an early medieval metal armlet from East Garston Down, a 13th century bronze Virgin and Child seal from Shepherd's Bottom and two late medieval silver coins found during a metal detectorists' rally at Grange Farm.

Post-medieval records are also scarce and consist of a probable deserted farming site and two listed buildings. Earthworks of buildings platforms and small enclosures immediately west of Winterdown Barn were interpreted as related to sheep farming. These have now been levelled by ploughing. The listed buildings are Harrow Cottage, a 19th century cottage on the fringe of Great Shefford, and a nearby 18th century milestone from the Hungerford to Wantage turnpike road, now the A338.

Historic Environment Potential

Deposits of Bronze Age to Romano-British date are likely across the zone but preservation may be varied. Cropmarks are most extensive in areas of former downland that have only been enclosed and cultivated relatively recently. The remainder of the zone has been ploughed since the medieval period and cropmarks do exist but are less extensive. Ploughing is likely to have caused significant truncation of many features. The extent of survival of the cropmark features is unclear as few have been excavated, and deposits may range from relatively intact to very ephemeral and illegible. The origin of the farms is unknown, and any deposits relating to early occupation at these sites could help to understand the history and development of the settlements. Nothing is known about the nature of the historic building stock and it is possible that significant buildings or structural elements exist.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- The open aspect of this zone is part of its historic character; will this be maintained with changing agricultural practices?
- Intensive modern agriculture threatens the resource on buried archaeological sites.
- Development pressure is forcing settlement to expand out of the valley floor onto the lower slopes.
- The zone has high potential for Prehistoric and Roman archaeological discoveries.

Historic Environment Character Zone

- More detail is needed on the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource.
- Ancient woodland has not been well managed in recent years and this poses a threat to its survival.
- There is a need to ensure that any new tree planting avoids the visually and archaeologically erosive impacts of recent plantations. Where possible opportunities to soften the impact of recent plantations should be encouraged.

Research Priorities

- What was the nature of land use in the earlier Prehistoric period?
- Do the locations of the Bronze Age burial mounds tell us anything about the use of the landscape in this period?
- Are East Ditch and East Garston ditch remnants of a late Bronze Age land management re-organisation and representative of social and economic changes at this time?
- Was the landscape empty in the Iron Age?
- Do Romano-British rural settlements exist in the zone and how do they relate to the extensive field systems?
- What are the origins of the farmsteads in the zone?
- Do the historic buildings in the zone contain any information about post-medieval and modern changes to land use and agricultural systems?

LVDR Lambourn Valley and Downs – Racing

Historic Character

This zone comprises the head of the Lambourn valley and surrounding downs and contains the historic settlement of Upper Lambourn, in a landscape that is strongly associated with the horse racing industry. Historically, most of the zone was covered by downland with areas of open field existing around the village. The open field and down north of the village was enclosed into large regularly-shaped fields by the 18th century. Small irregularly-shaped fields, probably crofts, also existed immediately around the village by this date. The remaining land was enclosed into large regularly-shaped fields by Act of Parliament in the early 19th century. The six farms in the zone seem to have been established at the same time, and several were developed on the site of existing field barns. The large size and regularity of fields and the lack of woodland gave a very open character to the zone. It also had a very sinuous grain due to the convergence of several dry valleys at Upper Lambourn and the existence of numerous routes radiating from the valley floor to surrounding watersheds.

Agricultural mechanisation from the mid-20th century led to changes as many existing fields were amalgamated into larger holdings. The growth of Lambourn as a nationally important centre of the racehorse industry has resulted in large areas of land being devoted to horse breeding and training. Extensive areas of former fields and downs are now areas of gallops. Several studs have been established, and large areas of paddocks exist at Upper Lambourn and Sheepdrove. Many studs are within Upper Lambourn itself, although studs were also established at the historic farms on the downs above Lambourn. Several tree plantations were created in the late 20th century, most are small rectangular shelter features, but some are more irregular in shape. These intrude into the character of the zone which was previously very open and almost totally unwooded. Although some historic features such as hedgerows have been removed, changes have had a less dramatic effect than in other parts of the district as many historic fields were already fairly large and regular. The overall character is largely retained as the open and sinuous framework of the landscape remains.

Historic Environment

HER records are densely distributed across the zone and are dominated by cropmarks and findspots. The zone was covered by the Berkshire Downs Survey and the National Mapping Programme and both added significant numbers of records to the HER. There are five scheduled monuments: Farncombe Down barrow; Fognam Clump field-system; two prehistoric boundary earthworks (one runs from Bailey Hill to Near Down and the other is on Baydon Hole Farm); and Maddle Farm Roman villa.

Prehistoric records are widespread, but early material is fairly scarce. No Palaeolithic material has been recovered from this zone and Mesolithic finds are also scarce, consisting of finds of blades from fieldwalking at Wellbottom Down and Post Down. Evidence of Neolithic activity is also scarce, but is more common than in adjacent parts of the valley. Neolithic flintwork, including axe fragments, have been found at Park Farm, Wellbottom Down and Kingsdown all-weather gallop. Other evidence of activity for this period has been found during excavations including a pit at the Kingsdown Gallop and burials at Halfmoon Covert. Bronze Age material is quite widespread and consists largely of barrows, including the scheduled barrow at Farncombe Down, and other probable barrows. One barrow is visible at Farncombe Down but two barrows existed there until the mid-20th century when the other was bulldozed. This has since been excavated and a burnt area underlying the barrow has been interpreted as traces of Neolithic or early Bronze Age settlement. Cropmarks of ring-ditches exist at Park Farm, Wether Down,

Foxbury Farm, Lambourn and northeast of the Seven Barrows cemetery. The ring ditches north of Lambourn have been interpreted as a probable barrow cemetery. They lie on the sides of the same dry valley that has the Lambourn Seven Barrows cemetery at its head. Late Bronze Age artefact scatters were found at Park Farm Down and seem to be a combination of settlement and funerary activity.

Definite Iron Age material is scarce and consists of an artefact scatter southeast of Maddie Farm that has been interpreted as settlement evidence, and traces of plough strips found during excavation of nearby later lynchets. The scheduled long-distance linear boundary features at Baydon Hole Farm and Near Down are also thought to be of Iron Age date. Extensive cropmarks of field-systems that exist across the zone have generally been ascribed a later prehistoric/Romano-British date. Elements of the field-systems survived until recently as earthworks, but have been levelled by the increased intensity of ploughing.

Significant Romano-British activity, in addition to the field-systems, is documented in this zone. Evidence of settlement is widespread and includes the 2nd to 3rd century villa at Maddie Farm. Fieldwalking by the Maddie Farm Project found dense scatters of Romano-British artefacts that were interpreted as settlements west of Upper Lambourn and north east of the villa site. Excavation on Row Down found post holes and a hearth dated to this period, and these were interpreted as a dwelling. Several burials have been found around Upper Lambourn, three graves were found at Lynchets and an isolated burial was found on Kingsdown Gallop. Finds of this date, mostly coins, have been recovered from across the zone.

Early medieval records are uncommon and consist of a pit excavated at Upper Lambourn and a barrow at Row Down. The pit has been tentatively interpreted as evidence of settlement at Upper Lambourn during this period and lies outside the historic core of the village. There are also very few late medieval records. The origins of Upper Lambourn are unclear, but it is likely that the village developed in the medieval period. The earliest recorded buildings in the village are five 16th century timber framed buildings. Earthworks on Warren Down have been interpreted as relating to late medieval warrening.

Post-medieval records consist solely of listed buildings. There are 24 listed buildings and all, apart from Park Farm, are in Upper Lambourn village. The majority of the listed structures are either 16th to 17th century cottages or 18th century farm buildings. The pub and the former Methodist chapel are also listed. Park Farm is the only one of the 19th century farms that is listed. These farms are important features and reflect the move away from traditional common agriculture to enclosure. Large parts of Upper Lambourn are designated as a Conservation Area, which is split into two parts.

Historic Environment Potential

Deposits of Bronze Age to Romano-British date are likely across the zone, but preservation may be varied. Deep ploughing is likely to have caused significant truncation of many features. The extent of survival of the cropmark features is unclear as few have been excavated, and deposits may range from relatively intact to very ephemeral and illegible. Deposits of occupation from the medieval period onwards are likely in Upper Lambourn and could be crucial to understanding its development. The 19th century farms are important features, but little is known about the nature of their historic building stock. It is possible that further significant buildings or structural elements may exist at Upper Lambourn and the 19th century farms.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- The open aspect of this zone is part of its historic character; will this be maintained with changing agricultural practices?
- Intensive modern agriculture threatens the resource on buried archaeological sites.
- There are a small number of earthwork archaeological monuments that require careful management to ensure their preservation.
- The horse racing industry is under pressure to move stables away from traditional sites within settlements to new 'greenfield' sites closer to the gallops. The development of new facilities of this type could threaten the historic character of the zone.
- The move towards 'all weather gallops' threatens the survival of the traditional grass gallops.
- There is a need to ensure that any new tree planting avoids the visually and archaeologically erosive impacts of recent plantations. Where possible opportunities to soften the impact of recent plantations should be encouraged.
- More detail is needed on the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource.
- A Conservation Area appraisal and management plan for Upper Lambourn is overdue.

Research Priorities

- What was the nature of land use in the earlier Prehistoric period?
- Is there any relationship with prehistoric land-use patterns in this zone with the adjacent Ridgeway corridor?
- Do the locations of the Bronze Age burial mounds tell us anything about the use of the landscape in this period?
- Where are the Romano-British settlements and how do they relate to the Villa at Maddle Farm and the extensive field systems?
- Does Upper Lambourn have early medieval origins? Do deposits from this period survive in the village?
- Do the historic buildings in the zone contain any information about post-medieval and modern changes to land use and agricultural systems?

LVF Lambourn Valley Floor

Historic Character

This long narrow zone occupies the valley floor between Lambourn and the confluence with the Winterbourne and contains most of the historic settlements in the upper and middle Lambourn Valley. Almost all settlements are villages and hamlets of medieval or earlier origin and are sited on the valley floor at fairly regular intervals. Each settlement contains a historic farm and in the larger villages (Eastbury, East Garston, Great Shefford, Boxford) there are two or three. Historically, the remainder of the valley floor was covered by meadow land, which was a common grazing resource shared between the settlements. Most meadows had been enclosed by the 18th century; some were simply enclosed into pasture fields, but the majority became water meadows. These covered the valley floor between East Garston and Bagnor and formed the district's most significant concentration of water-meadows outside the Kennet Valley. The small remaining areas of meadow were enclosed into fields by act of Parliament early in the 19th century. Welford Park is the only park lying within the zone; it originated as a deer park in the mid 16th century if not earlier.

Significant alteration has occurred in this zone since the mid 20th century. Active management of water meadows ceased in the earlier 20th century and most have now become either arable or pasture fields. Significant areas of water meadow at Welford have become wooded, either through active plantation or re-colonisation, and this has introduced a wooded element to the valley floor that did not previously exist. Settlement growth has been modest and has centred on East Garston, West Shefford, and Boxford. Development has consisted of infill or growth around existing settlements and little redevelopment has occurred in the historic cores. Most housing was built in the late 20th century, but a small amount of growth took place at East Garston in the late 19th century.

Historic Environment

There are many HER records in this zone, predominantly built structures and records of medieval and later settlement concentrated in the historic cores. The zone was covered by both the Berkshire Downs Survey and National Mapping Programme, but neither yielded much information. The land in this zone is unfavourable to cropmark production, being an alluvial area used mainly for pasture, and because arable land is limited there is therefore little scope for fieldwalking. The references to artefact finds are mostly from 19th or early 20th century discoveries, and although numerous, are often only generally located within parishes or settlements. Other archaeological work is limited to a few excavations by local archaeologists and work carried out prior to development.

Prehistoric activity is not well-documented and most records are of chance finds. Some Mesolithic activity is evident from finds of this period at Elton Farm, East Shefford and Great Shefford, but it is unclear whether any of this material is indicative of the existence of settlements of this period. Neolithic material has been found only at Great Shefford and during fieldwalking at Maidencourt Farm and the nature of activity in this zone during this period is unclear. Later prehistoric material is also scarce; only Bronze Age finds and some flintwork from Maidencourt, an urn from Boxford churchyard and a single Iron Age find has been recorded. There is significant cropmark evidence of later prehistoric settlement and farming on the valley sides and it is likely that the river and valley floor were heavily exploited. Features of these periods probably exist but have not been recognised due to a lack of both cropmark development and opportunities for chance finds.

Romano-British activity is documented only by finds, mostly of which are coins. Finds of this date have been recovered from Bagnor, Boxford, East Garston and Eastbury. Again, this zone was probably intensively used, as significant cropmark evidence of Romano-British activity exists on the valley sides. Features of this date are likely to exist but have probably not been recognised due to a lack of both cropmark development and opportunity to discover chance finds.

There is evidence for early medieval settlement at several locations. Boxford and Welford were both referred to in 10th century documents, and Bagnor was mentioned as having a mill in Domesday. A settlement at Shefford was also mentioned in Domesday, but whether this refers to East Shefford and/or Great Shefford is unclear as the earliest reference to separate settlements was not until the 13th century. Apart from 11th century elements in Boxford church, little is known of the nature or extent of each settlement during this period as no deposits of this date have been discovered. A pre-8th century inhumation cemetery was found and partially excavated at East Shefford during the railway construction, but it is unclear if there was a contemporary settlement near this location. A further, possibly isolated burial was also found during railway works between East Garston and Eastbury.

Most historic settlements had developed by the end of the late medieval period; evidence of settlement at Elton Farm and Woodspeen is lacking, but it is probable that these also developed in this period. The churches at East Garston, East Shefford, Great Shefford, Welford and Boxford all retain significant medieval elements despite Victorian alteration. Great Shefford and Welford churches are also notable for their unusual towers. The earliest other buildings are a 14th century house at East Garston and a 15th century house at Great Shefford, but most surviving buildings are 16th century. Buildings of this date exist at Boxford, Westbrook, Easton, Great Shefford and East Garston. Evidence of desertion or shrinkage exists at several settlements: East Shefford, Maidencourt, Bockhampton and Boxford. East Shefford was formerly a larger settlement and Hug Ditch Court, an unoccupied moated site and scheduled ancient monument, lies in the centre of the hamlet. Maidencourt had contracted to a farm by the 18th century but no medieval features have been recorded at the site. Bockhampton had also shrunk to a farm by this date but settlement earthworks and a 17th century manor house remain. The earthworks are a Scheduled Monument and include building platforms, hollow ways, field boundaries and a chapel site. Earthworks south of Boxford indicate that some contraction of this village has occurred. There is documentary evidence for a monastery at Welford Park, but no apparent physical remains of it.

Post-medieval records are of buildings, industrial structures and transport features. Much of the building stock at each settlement dates from this period, including a Victorian church at Eastbury. Watermills existed at most historic settlements and the majority of remaining mill buildings date from this period. It is possible that these are on the site of medieval mills. A forge building, converted to housing, survives at East Garston. The Lambourn Valley Railway was constructed through the zone in the 1890s. It was closed in 1973 and most elements of it, including stations, were removed but the line of the railway is largely preserved as a wooded earthwork. There are over 130 listed buildings in this zone and most are 16th to 18th century domestic structures and farm buildings. Other listed structures include the six churches, buildings at Welford Park, three mills and a forge. Conservation Areas have been designated at Bagnor, Boxford, Westbrook, Great Shefford (a small area around the manor house and church), East Garston and Eastbury.

Historic Environment Character Zone

Historic Environment Potential

The potential for archaeological deposits of Romano-British and earlier date is hard to assess as limited material of these dates has been recovered. The adjacent valley sides were heavily-utilised and it is probable that the valley floor was also exploited during these periods. Deposits relating to this exploitation may exist, but it is not possible to be more specific about their quality and location. Deposits of occupation from the early medieval onwards are likely in historic settlement nuclei, and any such deposits could be crucial to understanding the development of settlement in this zone. Several deserted or shrunken medieval village sites exist and any deposits at these could be valuable as desertion is a poorly understood phenomenon in the district. The historic building stock seems well-studied but it is possible that further significant buildings or structural elements may be identified.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- Development pressure is forcing settlement to expand, threatening their historic character.
- Conservation Area appraisals and management plans are overdue.
- More detail is needed on the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource.
- Earthwork sites representing settlement desertion, shrinkage and shift need careful management.
- Management of water meadow systems.

Research Priorities

- Does the Mesolithic material demonstrate evidence of population utilising the river valleys to move away from the core zone of activity in the Kennet Valley?
- Is the absence of Prehistoric and Romano-British material from this zone an accurate reflection of settlement patterns and landscape utilisation in these periods?
- What is the nature of the early Saxon activity at East Shefford? How does this relate to recent settlement finds near Lambourn?
- What were the origins of the settlements at Bockhampton and Maidencourt Farm and why did they not survive?
- What information do the shrunken/deserted settlements contain for understanding how medieval population utilised the landscape?
- Can evidence for settlement evolution in the Lambourn valley be found without the existing settlements?
- What kind of a monastic institution existed at Welford and what evidence of it survives?
- Do the historic buildings in the zone contain any information about post-medieval and modern changes to land use and agricultural systems?
- Can the physical remains of the Lambourn Valley branch line help us understand late 19th century railway engineering?

LVSA Lambourn Valley - Scattered Archaeological records

Historic Character

This zone is the southern side of the valley from Lambourn and Farn Combe to Welford, split into two parts by the adjacent HECZ *WDNR*. Historically, this zone was mostly covered by open fields with areas of downland southwest of Lambourn, East Garston and Maidencourt. Small areas of ancient woodland and common existed south of Welford Park. Welford's open field was enclosed into irregularly-shaped fields by the 18th century, probably through piecemeal enclosure. The open field of East Garston had been enclosed into regularly-shaped fields by the 18th century, probably created through an agreement between farmers. The remaining land was enclosed into fields by acts of Parliament in the early 19th century. Small areas of downland southwest of Lambourn and East Garston remained unenclosed. Settlement was almost entirely absent with only four farms in the zone. All were located near the edge of the zone; Westfield Farm lay near the valley floor within early enclosures at East Garston, and the other farms were sited near the top of the valley slope. The only parks in the zone were Welford Park and a minor parkland at Oakhanger House. The zone was crossed by roads and tracks linking the valley floor and watershed giving a very sinuous, open grain to the landscape.

Agricultural mechanisation from the mid-20th century led to changes in the landscape as existing fields were amalgamated, either through boundary removal or reorganisation. Although some historic features such as hedgerows have been removed, this process has had a less dramatic effect than in other parts of the district as many historic fields were already fairly large and regular. Some historic fields, including a group of Parliamentary enclosures at Eastbury, survive in the present farming landscape. Downland areas remain unenclosed. Despite changes to the majority of fields in this zone, the character and grain of the landscape remains largely intact.

Historic Environment

Although HER records exist across the zone they are not common and are unevenly distributed, with most at the northern and southern end and few in the centre. Records are dominated by cropmarks, many discovered by the National Mapping Programme and the Berkshire Downs Survey, and finds. Some excavation and survey has been carried out by local archaeological groups.

Prehistoric activity is documented by finds and cropmarks, but this is not as widespread or extensive as in adjacent parts of the Lambourn valley. Only a single early prehistoric find has been recovered from the zone, a Mesolithic tranchet axe from Coppington Down. Cropmarks of probable Bronze Age round barrows have been mapped west and south of Dore's Farm and immediately south of Eastbury, with less certain examples at Farn Combe. A Bronze Age artefact scatter was located by fieldwalking north of Wickham and other finds were recovered near Hungerford Gap south of Lambourn. Only one Iron Age find has been recovered from the zone, a rare Italian brooch from Windmill Farm. Some level of activity during this period is indicated by cropmarks of field systems of later prehistoric/Romano-British date that have been mapped at Lodge Down, Coppington Down and near Eastbury. The most extensive area is between Dore's Farm and Eastbury, and includes boundaries, trackways and a possible pit cluster.

In addition to the activity indicated by the field-systems, Romano-British finds have been recovered from Hatchet's Corner, Hungerford Gap, southwest of Bockhampton, near Wickfield Copse, Weston, Oakhanger House and Welford Park. No other features of this date have been excavated.

Historic Environment Character Zone

Early medieval records are rare and consist only of a strap fitting found near Bockhampton, a knife from Welford and a 6th - 7th century saucer brooch found immediately south of Eastbury. Late medieval records are slightly more common and include a 16th century timber-framed house at Welford, pottery found during building at Hayfield Court, Eastbury, and lynchets on West Field Down, East Garston. The lynchets were excavated in the 1930s and seem to have been formed in the 15th century. It has been suggested that Wickfield Farm is a deserted medieval village, but no physical remains of a settlement have been found at the site yet.

The only recorded post-medieval feature is Farncombe Windmill. This stood on Farncombe Down into the 20th century, but was demolished when Windmill Farm was constructed. The mill site itself is grassed-over and has not been developed and it is possible that below-ground deposits relating to it survive. The three historic farms remain occupied but nothing is known of the nature of the buildings at each farm.

Undated human remains have been found at two locations. Part of a skeleton was found at Windmill Farm near the findspot of the Iron Age brooch and an inhumation without grave goods was found during building works at Hayfield Lodge, Eastbury.

Historic Environment Potential

Deposits of Bronze Age to Romano-British date may exist across the zone, particularly where there are cropmarks of potential barrows and field systems. The preservation of deposits may be varied, as most of the zone has been ploughed since the medieval period and this may have truncated archaeological layers. Deposits related to medieval settlement may be encountered at Wickfield Farm. The origin of the other three farms is unclear and any deposits relating to early occupation at these sites could help in understanding their history and development. Nothing is known about the nature of the historic building stock at the farms and it is possible that significant buildings or structural elements might exist.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- The open aspect of this zone is part of its historic character; will this be maintained with changing agricultural practices?
- Intensive modern agriculture threatens the resource on buried archaeological sites.
- Ancient woodland has not been well managed in recent years and this poses a threat to its survival.
- There is a need to ensure that any new tree planting avoids the visually and archaeologically erosive impacts of recent plantations. Where possible opportunities to soften the impact of recent plantations should be encouraged.

Research Priorities

- What was the nature of land use in the earlier Prehistoric period?
- Do the locations of the Bronze Age burial mounds tell us anything about the use of the landscape in this period?
- Where are the Romano-British settlements and how do they relate to the extensive field systems?
- Do medieval occupation deposits survive at Wickfield Farm?
- Do buried remains of the windmill survive at Farncombe? What date was this structure?
- What are the origins of the farmsteads in the zone?
- What is the nature and date of the burials recorded at Windmill Farm and Hayfield Lodge?

WDNR Wooded Downs – not Roman

Historic Character

This is a sparsely occupied rural zone bisected into northern and southern parts by Ermin Street and its related Roman activity. The zone is a mix of arable fields and large woods and also contains some areas of parkland and studs. The M4 runs through the southern part of this zone.

Historically, the zone was characterised by irregularly-shaped assarts and fields and large blocks of ancient semi-natural woodland. The historic settlement pattern of the zone was dispersed and typified by scattered small farms. Much of this landscape is likely to date back at least to the medieval period. The zone was crossed by numerous small roads and tracks leading from the floors of the Kennet and Lambourn valleys up to the top of the watershed. The roads and irregularly-shaped fields and woods gave a very fluid, sinuous grain to the landscape.

Agricultural changes and the construction of the M4 have led to significant modification of the zone over the latter part of the 20th century. Landscapes have seen large scale rationalisation through a combination of field reorganisation and boundary removal, and this has created a much less irregular-looking landscape. The conversion of historic enclosures into paddocks is common and this is most widespread around the Kingwood Stud. Some blocks of historic fields survive around Lambourn Woodlands and East Garston Woodlands and south of King's Heath. Other elements of the landscape, such as woods, have not seen as much change.

Historic Environment

HER records are fairly sparse and there has been little archaeological work carried out on the ground. The zone was covered by both the Berkshire Downs Survey and the National Mapping Programme (NMP), but little excavation has taken place. The NMP mapped several groups of cropmark features thought to be part of later prehistoric/Romano-British field systems. Cropmarks interpreted as a possible Bronze Age barrow have been mapped west of North Hidden Farm, although predominantly Roman material was collected in the interior. However a barrow of more clearly Bronze Age date near Shefford Park Farm was excavated on at least two occasions. Other prehistoric material is not common and is mostly limited to finds of worked flint from a handful of locations. Despite being bisected by a significant Roman road, evidence of Romano-British activity in this zone is very limited apart from the possibly contemporary field systems, and consists of finds from three locations. Suggested early medieval evidence comes from an inhumation burial found near Horseclose Copse. Records of late medieval activity are also scarce and limited to two areas of lynchets north-east of Rooksnest Farm. A linear earthwork of possible medieval date, Hug Ditch, runs along the part of the boundary between this HECZ and LVSA to the east.

Later activity is documented predominantly by standing buildings. There are 16 listed buildings in the zone and this represents a high proportion of the historic building stock. The majority of listed buildings are farm buildings of the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries, with country houses at Rooksnest and Inholmes. As with the neighbouring HECZ *WDR*, Second World War military remains are found on land that was occupied by Membury airfield. Concrete runways remain within fields, and buildings related to the airfield are found over an extensive area to the north and east, many of which have been re-used for alternative, mainly industrial, uses.

Historic Environment Character Zone

Historic Environment Potential

It is hard to assess the archaeological resource in this zone as little is known of the extent and quality of below-ground deposits. It is likely that prehistoric and Romano-British deposits are present where cropmarks of field systems exist, but it is not clear how well the features represented survive. A woodland archaeology survey of banks and enclosures in Coldridge Copse suggests that there may be other unrecorded earthworks in other woods in this zone. It is unclear whether the early medieval burial was an isolated burial or part of a cemetery; if the latter, the rest of the burial ground is likely to exist within the area. The historic farm sites retain significant historic buildings and it is possible that deposits relating to early settlement and use of these sites may also remain. Any such deposits could be crucial in understanding the enclosure and exploitation of this zone from the medieval period onwards.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- The irregular pattern of fields, woods and roads are part of the historic character of this zone. Will this be changed with modern agricultural practices?
- Management of woodlands, conservation of surviving ancient woodlands and replacement of plantations with more mixed tree coverage.
- Intensive modern agriculture threatens the resource on buried archaeological sites
- Development of historic farms and farm buildings.
- Nature and condition of historic building stock
- Identify and record the various dispersed WWII features.

Research Priorities

- What is the nature of the Bronze Age activity identified at North Hidden Farm?
- Where are the Romano-British settlements and how do they relate to the extensive field systems and the Roman road?
- Does evidence survive on the nature and origins of the early medieval activity?
- What is the extent of the possible early medieval cemetery at Horseclose Copse?
- Do the historic farm buildings in the zone contain any information about post-medieval and modern changes to land use and agricultural systems?

WDR Wooded Downs – Roman

Historic Character

This is a zone of mixed land-use defined by a buffer around the known concentration of HER records around Ermin Street. The extent is a reflection of the presence of known archaeology and, as no modern landscape rationale underlies it, the edges of the zone do not necessarily follow “real-world” boundaries. The zone is bisected by Ermin Street and contains a mix of fields, wooded areas, a stretch of the M4 including Membury Services and the former Membury airfield. Several historic settlements are sited on the road, but little is known of their origin and development.

Historic Environment

The dominant feature is the Ermin Street Roman road which still forms the major route through this zone as the B4000. The zone was covered by the Berkshire Downs Survey and aerial photograph transcription and analysis by the National Mapping Programme. Little other archaeological work has been carried out in the zone. Prehistoric material is not common and the only finds from this zone are a Mesolithic core and a Bronze Age axe. The north-eastern corner of Membury Camp hillfort is within this zone and is a scheduled ancient monument. Little is known about this hillfort as no excavations are known on the site. Cropmarks of field systems and boundaries thought to be of later prehistoric/ Romano-British date have been mapped at the extreme north-west of the zone. Although the course of Ermin Street is well-known and it is still largely in use, there has been limited investigation of the physical nature of the road itself. Other Romano-British features have been observed in this zone. A probable building was located on the site of Membury Services and a group of Romano-British features, including a corn-drier, were excavated at Lodge Farm prior to construction of the M4. Two furnaces excavated during road diversion at Lambourn Woodlands are the only medieval features known in this zone.

Later periods are represented almost entirely by standing buildings. The zone contains 12 listed buildings and the majority of these are 17th century cottages and 17th to 19th century farm buildings. Both Lambourn Woodlands and Shefford Woodlands contain 17th century buildings but it is unclear how long prior to this they date back. It is also unknown what their relationship to Lambourn and Great Shefford was.

Second World War military remains are found on land that was occupied by Membury airfield. Concrete runways remain within fields, and buildings related to the airfield are found over an extensive area to the north and east, many of which have been re-used for alternative, mainly industrial, uses.

Historic Environment Potential

The potential for buried archaeological deposits is varied across this zone. Earth moving during construction is thought to have removed all archaeological deposits from the areas covered by the M4 and Membury Services. It is likely that this has occurred to some extent in the area formerly occupied by Membury airfield. Prehistoric material is scarce but deposits may exist in this zone, particularly at Membury Camp and in the area of cropmarked field systems. The quality of deposits at Membury Camp hillfort is unclear. This section of the hillfort is covered by ancient semi-natural woodland and it is likely that tree-roots have caused disturbance of the Iron Age deposits. Physical remains of the Roman road are likely to survive underneath the present road surface and in areas on the course of the road where the modern route has been diverted. Excavations in advance of the M4 found some evidence for contemporary settlement along Ermin Street and it is possible that further settlement deposits are located on the course of the

road. Deposits relating to early settlement development are likely to survive within the historic settlement nuclei. Any such deposits are likely to be crucial to understanding the development of settlement in this zone. There has been limited study of the historic building stock and it is possible that further significant structures will be identified.

Historic Environment Action Plan

Conservation Issues

- Varied archaeological resource
- The origins of Lambourn Woodlands and Shefford Woodlands is poorly understood
- Identify and record the various dispersed WWII features.
- More detail is needed on nature condition and extent of the historic building stock to ensure appropriate policies are put in place to conserve this resource

Research Priorities

- Is the paucity of prehistoric remains a true reflection of activity in the zone?
- How does the Roman road relate to the settlement features discovered along its route, and how representative are they of contemporary and later activity along this route, and in the area in general?
- What is the nature and construction of the Roman road?
- Can the Roman Road be shown to have continuity of use into the post-medieval era?
- What is the extent and condition of the historic building stock?

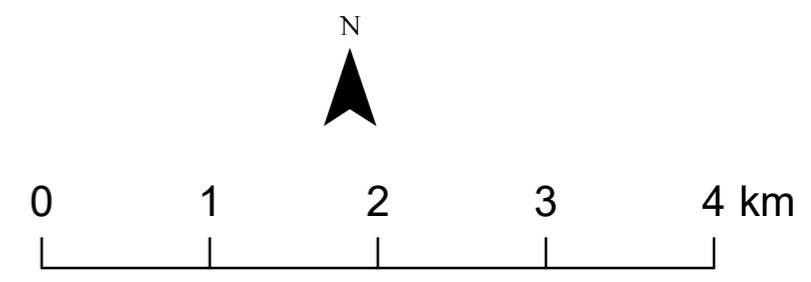


Map showing Listed Buildings within Lambourn Parish

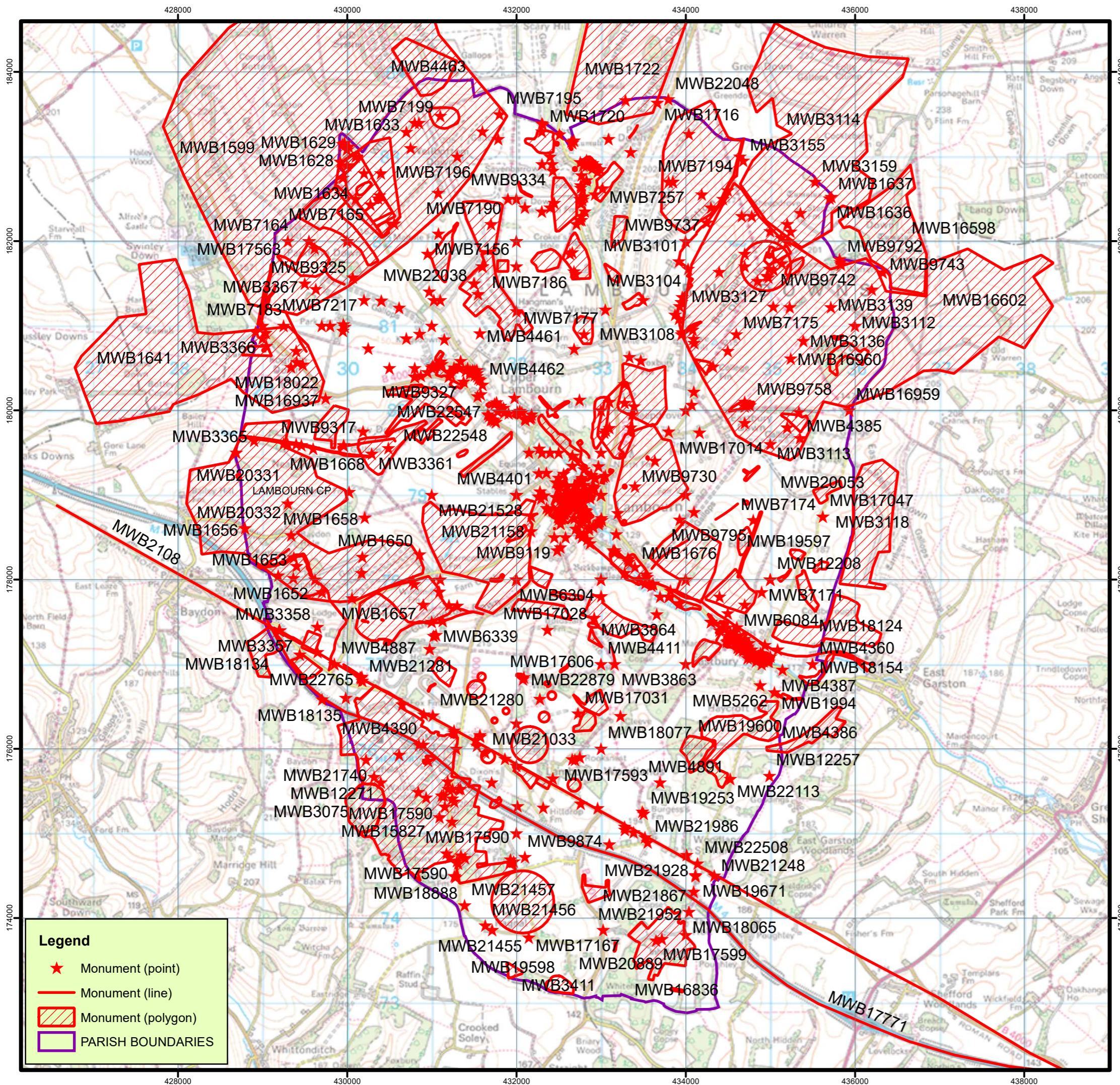

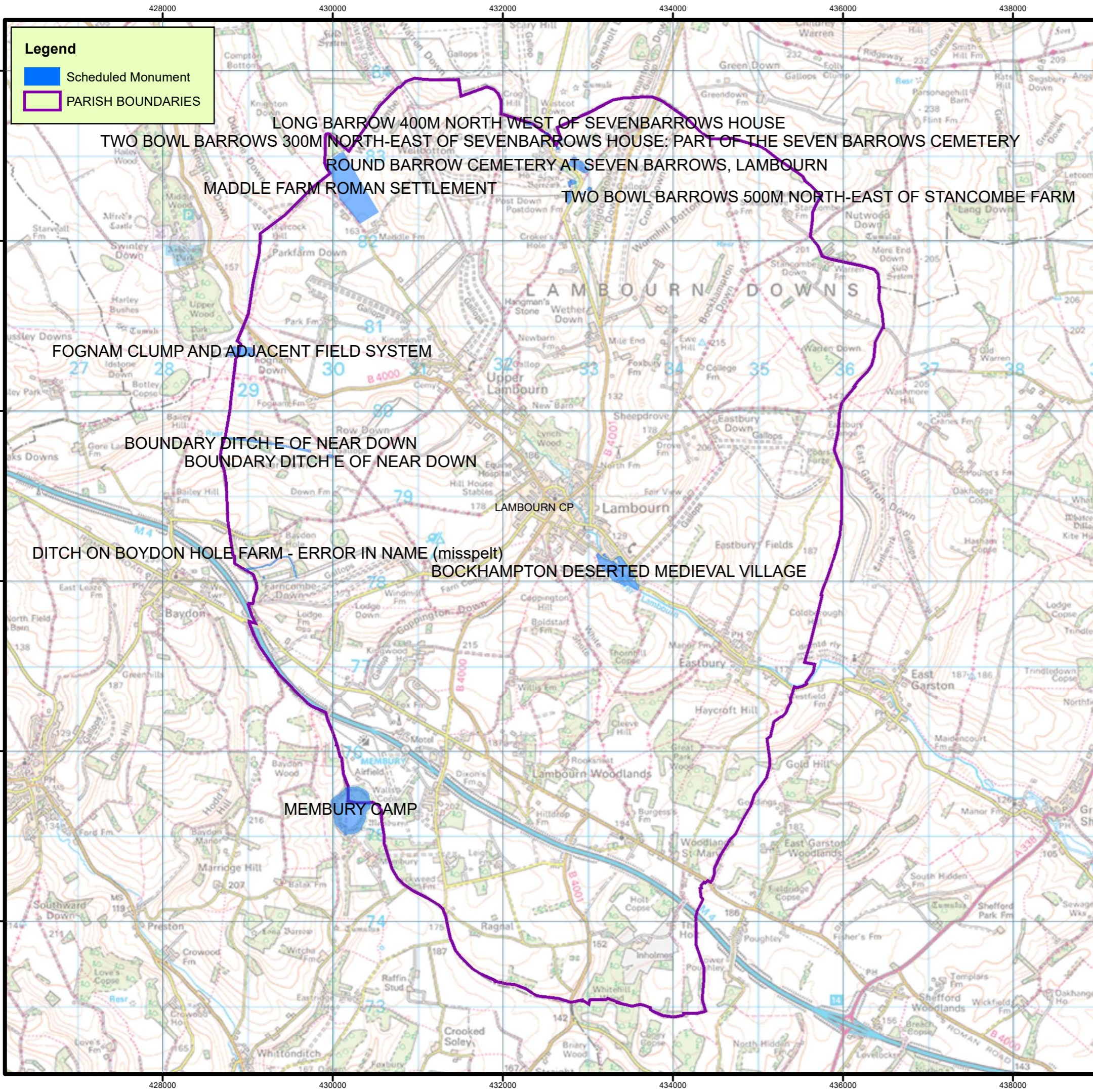

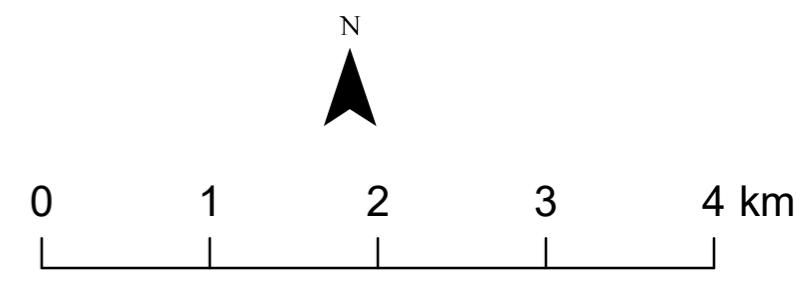


**Map showing

63	enclosures and farming	ancient field system	prehistoric - Roman	Earthworks and cropmarks of complexes of fields which appear to form a coherent system, used only as a previous type.
7	enclosures and farming	assarted enclosure	pre 18th century	Fields created by the enclosure and clearance of woodland or common heath, mostly medieval in origin.
3	enclosures and farming	pre18thC irregular fields	pre 18th century	Irregularly-shaped, small to medium sized fields with boundaries composed mainly of hedges. They are representative of the later medieval/early post-medieval, and possibly earlier, methods of farming in the district.
15	enclosures and farming	pre18thC sinuous fields	pre 18th century	A sinuous form of early enclosures, usually bounded by hedges, which are similar in origin to HLC type Pre 18th century Irregular Fields.
